The Dormition of Our Most Holy the Theotokos & Ever Virgin Mary

The Dormition of the Mother of God is not recorded in the Scriptures. What we know of her Dormition (or 'falling asleep') we draw from our Holy Tradition. Some Protestants who believe that the scriptures are the *only* source of authority are troubled by this idea but, as St. John writes at the end of his Gospel, "And there are also many other things... I suppose even the world itself could not contain the books that would be written." (John 21:25) In our Orthodox Faith, Holy Tradition carries equal weight with the Holy Scriptures. In fact the Scriptures are only truly to be understood through, and are themselves really a part of Holy Tradition.

The Dormition story is full of wonder. The Apostles and Disciples were gathered at her bedside when she reposed, for she died a natural death, being fully human just like each of us. Then Christ Himself descended, took his Mother's soul, and carried it right into Heaven. Mary's body was laid in a tomb in Jerusalem, but when the Apostle Thomas came to say farewell to her three days later, he found the tomb to be completely empty. It is our Tradition that the Holy Theotokos' body was resurrected and she was taken up into Heaven bodily; the Feast of the Dormition is the guarantee that those who imitate her will become temples of the Holy Spirit and will inherit the Kingdom of God. The Dormition story gives all of us hope that Mary's example of meekness, holiness and obedience to God's will, in a sense gathers all of our shared humanity into this wonderful destination.

Good strength for the Dormition Fast, which starts on the 1st of August!

Church Council Meeting The Church Council met after the Divine Liturgy on Pentecost (23/06/2024) and discussed several matters, including: the future of St Helen's Chapel, new ways to allow people to give financially to the parish, safeguarding and facilities management.

Church Growth The number of regular worshippers on Sunday mornings has increased greatly since the early months of 2020 when we might have thirty or so people, it is now quite common for us to have more than 100 people for Divine Liturgy.



This is a phenomenon being witnessed across many Orthodox communities in the West, particularly in the UK and USA. Glory to God that He is bringing in so many new people!

The icon of the feast of the <u>Transfiguration of Our Lord & Saviour Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u>, directs our attention toward the event of the Transfiguration and specifically to the glory of God as revealed in Christ. This event came at a critical point in the ministry of our Lord, just as He was setting out on His journey to Jerusalem. He would soon experience the humiliation, suffering, and death of the Cross. However, the glorious light of the Resurrection was revealed to strengthen His disciples for the trials that they would soon experience. The feast also points to the great and glorious Second Coming of our Lord and the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God when all of creation will be transfigured and filled with light. <u>The feast comes during the Dormition Fast which starts on the 1st of August, and the rules are relaxed to allow fish, wine and oil to be consumed on the feast day.</u>
