

Happy New (Liturgical) Year! September brings once again, the start of a new church or liturgical year, in the ancient Byzantine tradition. How should we think about the liturgical year, this epic cycle of feasts and fasts, leading us through the whole life of Christ, His Most Holy Mother and His glorious saints? Is it simply a sort of calendar; a way of marking time and checking off our dutiful observance? It is so much more than this. It obviously has the function of a calendar in a basic way, to help us keep track of time, but that only goes so far. Does it also have a teaching element, helping us learn about the Gospel, the key points in Christian history, the example of the saints? Again, this is only one facet of the liturgical year. Is it designed to orient our spiritual life, to help us pray in the right way and for the right reasons? Once again, a true but limited definition. In fact the liturgical year, this beautiful, challenging and mystical journey exists to actually form Christ in us, to make real and imminent the events commemorated in the feasts, the lives of His saints and the deaths of His martyrs. We are given a mystical framework for our journey to the Kingdom of God, which is within us. And we must remember this: that outward journeys and observances, if they are not matched by a faithful and challenging inward journey, can avail us nothing. Let us embrace the inner and the outward journey. Let us allow Christ to create in us a clean heart and renew a right spirit within us as we faithfully and with joy enter this new Father Mark year which God in His mercy has deigned to grant us.

## The Feast of the Repose of St Helen, Equal to the Apostles

On Sunday 18 August, we celebrated the Feast of the Repose of St Helen. This date is not usually to be found in the Eastern calendar but is well known in the West, including Orthodox Western Rite communities. Of course we also celebrate the Feast of Ss Constantine § Helen on 21 May, but this additional opportunity to venerate our patron in particular (as she is known in the Orthodox Church; Equal to the Apostles) brings an added dimension to our devotion and honouring of this wonderful and important saint. We all enjoyed a delicious 'bring and share' lunch after the Liturgy. Heartfelt thanks to all who attended and contributed.


## National Heritage Open Days: Sept 14th and 15th

## **ST SILOUAN OF MOUNT** ATHOS - 24TH **SEPTEMBER**



"We have such a law: if you forgive, it means that God has forgiven you; but if you do not forgive your brother, it means that your sin remains with you."

Born in Russia in 1866 to devout Orthodox parents, he left for Mount Athos where he became a monk at the Monastery of St Panteleimon. An ardent ascetic, he received the grace of unceasing prayer and saw Christ in a vision. After long years of spiritual trial, he acquired great humility and inner stillness. He prayed and wept for the whole world as for himself, and he put the highest value on love for enemies. There is of course a local connection as his disciple and pupil Father, now Saint Sophrony (Sakharov), wrote and taught about the holy elder's life and teachings and founded the Monastery of St John the Baptist at Tolleshunt Knights, just a few miles from our church in Colchester. St Silouan is of course venerated there and we are continually blessed and protected by the prayers of that holy community.

On the path of humility, by your prayers you received Christ as your Master. In your heart the Holy Spirit witnessed to your salvation. Therefore all people called to live in hope, rejoice and celebrate your memory! Holy Father Silouan, pray to Christ God to save our souls. Troparion Tone 4
