A Day of Joy, Thanksgiving & Reflection

Sunday the 29th of December was a wonderful and poignant day in the life of our parish. Sayedna Silouan visited for the whole weekend and after celebrating the Holy Liturgy on Sunday 29th, declared the retirement of our dear Fr Alexander Haig as parish priest and elevated him to the rank of archpriest, in recognition of his long and faithful service to building God's church in Colchester and beyond. Fr Mark Shillaker was then installed as parish priest. St Martin's Church was packed with regular worshippers and many others of the faithful and friends whose lives have been touched by Fr Alexander's ministry and the love and support of his devoted Khouria Hilary. Their daughter Margaret was also in attendance, to lend her support and to sing in the choir. It was a beautiful and moving liturgy, with not a few tears on this most momentous of occasions. The service was followed by a splendid lunch provided by the faithful and held in Castle Methodist church hall, at which alongside the delicious food and fellowship, there were speeches and presentations. Many thanks to all who attended and helped arrange the day. May the Lord bless Fr Alexander's retirement as a new and fruitful spiritual journey! Pray for him and for all of us here in the parish.

A Remarkable Journey & Ministry

Pilgrimage to Orthodoxy: Father Alexander was involved, with a number of other Anglican clergy and their families, back in the early 1990s, in a movement towards Holy Orthodoxy led by Father Michael Harper of blessed memory, a well known Anglican priest of 30 years and subsequently Archpriest in the Antiochian Orthodox Church. This movement was not merely a reaction against certain controversial developments in the Church of England but was born of a deep faithfulness among the participants to the *traditional* Christian Faith. Ultimately a switch of allegiance to Holy Orthodoxy became the only tenable course of action for Father Alexander and his peers.

Ordination to the Diaconate and the Priesthood: Father Alexander was ordained deacon in Paris in the Spring of 1996 by the Antiochian Bishop Gabriel, and subsequently ordained priest, later that year in the same city by the same bishop. The community in Colchester could now become a parish in the proper sense and enter into the fullness of Orthodox worship and life.


Missions and A Faithful Community: Father Alexander, aided as ever by Khouria Hilary has done so much to spread the Orthodox Faith in the East of England. With the parish in Colchester as 'nucleus'; he was instrumental in establishing, now thriving Orthodox communities in Norfolk and Basildon as well as for many years serving a regular Divine Liturgy in Clacton and at the University of Essex (Fr Mark is now university chaplain).

The Chapel of St Helen, a new home..

The yet young Orthodox Community of St Helen acquired the ancient and beautiful St Helen's Chapel for use as a place of worship in November 2000. This was after some years in a number of temporary 'homes' including a local CO-OP funeral chapel. Father Alexander had, even before this, been looking for a permanent home for the parish among several local. decommissioned churches, including St Martin's Church, which the parish eventually acquired only in early 2022.

Unfortunately, the bridge over the River Colne at Middle Mill remains closed for another year, while Colchester City Council apparently has no firm plans to even begin repairs. I recently attended an event held by local people (including a friend of the parish and Castle Ward Councillor Kemal Cufoglu and former MP Bob Russell) to protest the City Council's inaction. We hope that the bridge, such an important route for cyclists and pedestrians and for those who live nearby, north of the river, will be repaired and opened again soon! Because of the closure we will again have the service for the Great Blessing of the Waters inside the church on Sunday 5th January, after the liturgy.
