Attending a weekday Liturgy brings a particular blessing

Christ, Light of the Nations, is born

HEN we talk of the Birth or Nativity of Christ we are not talking about his beginning, as our own existence begins at birth: he existed from all eternity, the Second Person of God the Holy Trinity.

What we are talking of is his Birth as a human being, just as important (from our point-of-view) as his eternal pre-existence as God.

In order truly to save us - lost in the depths of our own sinfulness, in our dreadfulness - we must have One who shares our humanity, who understands it from within, from experience.

When he returns to heaven at the Ascension,

The Angels tremble when they see

How changed is our humanity.
But he needs to be human in order to change it.

So, Christ Jesus - Son of God and Son of Mary - brings God and Man, God and us, together in his own Person. Our human life, our human existence, in him is utterly changed, in an absolute manner, transfigured.

For he has done it in his own Person. *He is* the God-Man.

How about that for a story to destroy the headlines of *humanity's* awful destruction of itself, our human sinfulness so evident whenever we read the papers and see all too much of on television?

Yes, Christ does bring Light into this dark world - Light and Hope, Peace and Joy.

Indeed, the Christ Child in Bethlehem is himself Light and Hope, Peace and Joy. May he have a real place in our

life, your life, the world's life, this Christmas time.

Here and There

GROUPS VISITING our church recently have included literature students from the University, art students from the Institute. Of course, we also get groups of day visitors to the town, and local groups catching up on their local history, as well as individuals and couples looking around. If you are a worshipper at St Helen's, do glance through the Visitors Book in church from time to time - sometimes people leave really lovely comments.

ST HELEN'S CHAPEL should now be in good condition for the coming years. The roof has been attended to, bits of wall have been restored (and will look a bit new for a while), the stone of the chimney (a relic of by-gone uses) renewed, and the porch brickwork tidied and roof renewed. It was all the responsibility of the Council as lease-holder (we are sub-lease-holders) and was done by the excellent firm Bakers of Danbury. For several weeks the church was covered not only in scaffolding but also in corrugated iron, which was unsightly, and disappointing for visitors, but that is now all gone.

COULD SOMEBODY VOLUNTEER to paint the interior walls of the church porch, please? - It looks very bedraggled now the roof and exterior have been done. Of course we ought to be thinking of getting the interior of the church itself painted again, for it is looking a little shabby after eleven years.

ST KYRANNA is a little-known local Saint of northern Greece, born in the village of Ossa near Thessalonica in 1731, martyred by the Turks in 1751. We here have known about her since the early days of the Parish, for soon after we started we had a Master's student, a Greek Army officer George Katanis here. His wife Ypermachi had a sister married to one of the Priests of Ossa, and they generously presented us with an original icon of St Kvranna - it is on the south wall of St Helen's. We have therefore had some devotion to her over the years, and indeed one of our new members, Frances Isacke, took the name for her Orthodox name when she was received. Now by chance we have learnt that the relics of the Saint have recently been discovered, and in the presence of the His All-Holiness the Ecumenical Patriarch were last month enshrined in a church newly built in her honour in the village.

TWO NEW LEAFLETS are now available, both of which you may well have read already as they are simply print-outs of the two notice-board papers, the one on **St Helen's Chapel**, the other on **The Colchester Shield** (which is really of course the shield of St Helen). Please take copies if you would like to send them to family or friends. Those who have only recently joined us may also find them illuminating.

FRIENDSFIRST is a simple modern, nation-wide Christian organisation to help those who wish to find a Christian marriage-partner to do so - in our modern society it can be particularly hard for devout people to find the right person. I spoke to them a while ago and they assured me that an enquirer can ask for an introduction to an Orthodox person. There are leaflets in the porch.

St Ignatius of Antioch


is often shown in icons with lions. He was a very early follower of Christ—some even say that he was the child in that crowd around Christ that the Lord said was to be the one we should imitate in purity and holiness.

Later he became second Bishop of Antioch after the foundation of the Church by St Peter and St Paul.

In old age he was arrested and taken to Rome. On the way he wrote a number of letters which have been preserved and provide a fascinating insight into life in the early days of the Christian Church.

Then he was thrown to the lions in the Coliseum in Rome, which you can visit today.

He is the predecessor in office of our present Father-in-God, His Beatitude Patriarch Ignatius IV.

A Word from the Fathers
