"No Cross, No Crown"

id you know that these words are the official motto of the Borough of Colchester? No? - not surprising, since very few seem to be aware of it. Even the Borough itself never uses it, as far as I have ever seen.

This is perhaps to be expected in this "post-Christian" British society, with its disregard for Christian values, its agnostic or even atheistic approach to the problems of social life.

Yet Colchester—Britain itself—is actually founded upon the Christian faith.

Look at the way that St Helen stands high above us on the Town Hall, how the town has so many beautiful and ancient churches - even if several are now "redundant".

No Cross, No Crown means that the only way to my true salvation is by personally accepting the way of suffering, the way of the Cross, as the way to the deep joy, hope, and peace which we call eternal life.

The Crucifixion of Christ leads us not to the dead-end of Death, but through that Death to Life, Salvation and ultimate meaning.



Enter this year, dear Friends, as fully as you are able into the services of Great and Holy Week. Some people may even be able to take holidays from work to participate as fully as possible.

Attend just as many as you possibly can, and discover the truth that deep participation in them does effectively lead us to the Resurrection of Christ in Holy Pascha. You won't regret it!

Enjoy Holy Week, not in a superficial way, but with the lasting and deep joy of Christ - and God bless you in doing it!

Father Alexander Our present position is that we wish to renew our lease of St Helen's Chapel after September. The possible acquisition of St Martin's, with installation of heating, is proving difficult, partly as we find it difficult to get information from its owners. Our new Archbishop has given his blessing for our projected plans. If they go ahead, there will have to be an Appeal for funds. Our Buildings Committee is working on all this. By car: leave Middleborough Roundabout (between dual carriageways Westway and Balkerne Hill), to Northgate; go straight along St Peter's Street to Castle Park; continue round the bend, up into Maidenburgh Street. The nearest car park is Nunns Road NCP, off St Peter's Street.


Our new Archbishop's least-day visit to St Helen's We are now planning exactly what
