The funds to buy this church, which will answer our needs to serve God and his Orthodox people, are almost in our hand. We praise God for that!


But it is not the full amount for which we have appealed, and we hope that more people yet will assist this parish in its hour of need.

their experience, pictured here with Catalin Fliscu and Reader George Harrison This was our first visit to an Archdiocesan conference after being received into the Church last year and we found it a very interesting and rewarding time; the facilities at the Yarnwood Park conference centre were excellent and the food was very

good too!

The theme of 'Nurturing Converts and Children in the Faith' provided plenty of opportunity for interesting talks and discussion. Subjects included catechising children and converts, the implications of social media for parishes, lessons for contemporary Orthodox mission in light of the history of Orthodoxy in Alaska and working pastorally with children and teenagers. It was encouraging to see the genuine interest and healthy debate during the question and answer section of each session.

His Eminence Metropolitan Silouan opened the conference and graciously provided his wise guidance throughout.

We particularly valued Sayedna's emphasis on the vital importance of prayer in the life of the archdiocese and, of course, of every Orthodox Christian; as he said: "without prayer, we are nothing."

reiterated by Sister Magdalen (from the Monastery of St John the Baptist, Tolleshunt Knights) who gave an excellent and thought provoking talk about her work with children and young people and reminded us that faithful prayer should be our first resort, rather than our last.

We think it is important to point out that the conference is not only for clergy but for ordinary lay-people too; we now feel much more connected to the wider archdiocese after attending and very much enjoyed getting to know clergy and lay-people from different parishes and communities.

There was plenty of time for socialising and informal chat and Sayedna made a point of instructing attendees to spend time with people they didn't already know.

The daily services of Matins and Vespers concluded with a Hierarchical Divine Liturgy on the last day and after closing sessions it was time for yet another hearty lunch before bidding our fond farewells to all.

A Word from the Fathers: St Hilary of Poitiers (c.310–c367)

I oliness, justice, human L temperance - this is the temple of God. This house therefore must be built by the agency of God, for one which is constructed by human efforts does not endure, nor does it stand firm when reared by the teachings of this age, nor will it be

kept safe by the care of vain toil and of our anxiety. It must be constructed in another way: it must be guarded in another way. It must not have its beginnings upon slippery and shifting sand. Its foundations must be laid firmly upon the prophets and apostles.
